ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key	questions)	
 Introduction: Explain to your child that s/he will be using a range of materials (wh decorate a plant pot (plastic cup/recycled jar). Give your child the opportunity to choose his/her own art resource his/her imagination. 		
• As your child gathers their materials, ask open ended questions to support his/her thinking. For		

example: What colours will you use for the pot and why? What kind of pot would they prefer: a cup, a mug, or a zip

lock bag? Will you create any patterns?

Main Activity:

Once your child has gathered the materials s/he would like to use, encourage your child to use his/her fine motor skills to pick up the decorative objects and stick them onto the pot.

Ask you r child more questions to encourage them to use language to explain their thoughts and ideas.

- Can you describe the patterns you have made?
- Can you describe the texture of the art resources? Are they soft, smooth, bumpy or hard?

Additional ways to support your child:	Extension:
Encourage your child to consider creating a pattern on their pot with repeating spots, stripes, shapes etc.	If you have paints available, encourage your child to mix primary colours together in order to create secondary colours they may like to decorate the pot/jar with?
