

Activity Title: Handprint Giraffe	
Learning Intention:	Activity Overview:
To experiment with colours and marks.	Use paint and your own hand to create a giraffe.
<ul> <li>Links to EYFS: Expressive Arts and Design: Media &amp; Materials:</li> <li>To experiment with colours and marks</li> </ul>	
Resources:	Key vocabulary:
<ul> <li><i>Giraffes Can't Dance</i> by Giles Andreae book or printed pictures</li> <li>Plain paper sheet</li> </ul>	Book, giraffe, paint, handprint, dance, press, pen, marker.
<ul> <li>Paint in desired colours (yellow, brown and black if you make a traditional giraffe)</li> </ul>	
Black marker or pen	
Note: if you don't have paint, check out the other giraffe making craft ideas, on the additional resource sheets).	
ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)	

## Introduction:

- Read or listen to the story *Giraffes Can't Dance* by Giles Andreae with your child.
- Talk with your child about the story; ask them to describe the main characters and talk about the actions.

## Main Activity:

- Get all your resources ready for your child to use, before you start the activity.
- Explain to your child that they are going to create a giraffe using their handprint.
- Let your child decide what colour their giraffe and spots are going to be.
- Help your child to paint their hand completely and press it on a piece of paper.
- Next, ask them to use their fingertips to make spots on the giraffe's body.
- Let it dry for a while.
- Once dried, help your child to draw a face on their giraffe.

- Ask your child questions such as:
- \*Did you enjoy that story?
- \*What was the story about?
- \*What character did you like the most?
- \*Did you enjoy making your own giraffe?
- \*Did you enjoy painting your hand?
