 Introduce your child to the resources and let them explore what is available. 	
 Use this opportunity to ask your chid questions about numerals. Do you know what number is on our own front door? 	
 Do you know what number is on our own front door? Do you have a favourite number? 	
Encourage your child to count from 1-10 Main Activity:	
Model the activity for your child:	
1) Choose a number card (e.g. 4) and put it on the house.	
 Count out 4 pigs by physically moving them and placing them in a line. 	
3) After counting the pigs, place them underneath the house.	
4) Count the amount of pigs again, pointing to one pig at a time and saying the number aloud.	
 Verbalise what you are doing and encourage your child to help you along matches with the numeral.
