

Activity Title: The Three Little Pigs - Number Matching Game	
Learning Intention: to count out amounts and match numerals with quantities.	Activity Overview: Explore numbers by counting them

<ul> <li>Introduce your child to the resources and let them explore what is available.</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Use this opportunity to ask your chid questions about numerals.</li> <li>Do you know what number is on our own front door?</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Do you know what number is on our own front door?</li> <li>Do you have a favourite number?</li> </ul>	
Encourage your child to count from 1-10     Main Activity:	
Model the activity for your child:	
1) Choose a number card (e.g. 4) and put it on the house.	
<ol> <li>Count out 4 pigs by physically moving them and placing them in a line.</li> </ol>	
3) After counting the pigs, place them underneath the house.	
4) Count the amount of pigs again, pointing to one pig at a time and saying the number aloud.	
<ol> <li>Verbalise what you are doing and encourage your child to help you along matches with the numeral.</li> </ol>	
• Put the resources back and invite your child to have a go. Choose a new	numeral to go on the house.
