

Individual Activity Lesson Plan

Date: Monday 27th April 2020	
Activity Title: Hot Seat Superhero	
Learning Intention: To answer questions sticking to a main theme.	Activity Overview: Interview your child to join Superworm's Superhero Club.
Links to EYFS: Links statements and sticks to a main theme or intention (Communication & Language).	
Resources: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A comfortable chair. • Use the questions highlighted in blue from the main activity. • Write out the questions on paper. • You could turn your paper into a scroll for creative effect. 	Key vocabulary: Job role, help, superpower, name, superhero, etc.
ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key questions)	
<u>Introduction</u> Ask your child to retell the story of Superworm. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use the following questions: • Who was the story about? • What happened in the story? • Can you name some of the things that Superworm did? <u>Main Activity:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explain to your child that you had a phone call from Superworm. • Inform s/he that Superworm is looking for a friend to join his Superhero Club. • Invite your child to be interviewed for the job. • Use the following questions for the activity: • Who is your favourite Superhero and why? • What is your superhero name? • What is your superpower? • How does your superpower help others? • What super foods do you eat to stay healthy? <u>Activity review:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Do you think you're ready to become a superhero? • What will your special powers be? • Will you have special superhero clothes? • What colours will they be? 	
Additional ways to support your child: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Remind your child that every superhero has a special power, their powers can help people in all different situations. 	Extension: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ask your child to draw/design his/her own superhero costume. • Get your child to think about different materials that can be used. Will it be a full outfit or just a t-shirt?
