### **ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)**

## **Introduction:**

- Introduce your child to a selection of simple rhyming words, or use the rhyming labels provided. *Cat, hat, bat, mat, froq, loq, doq etc.*
- Encourage your child to blend and read the words aloud so they have a basic understanding of rhyming words.
- What do you think a rhyming word is?
- Can you match this word to the correct rhyming word?

## **Main Activity:**

- Read the story Superworm to your child. If you do not have access to the story please follow the links provided.
- After each paragraph you read to your child, ask your him/her to think and make a collection of any rhyming words he/she may have heard in that paragraph.
- Can you think of any other rhyming words?
- How many rhyming words have you collected from the story?

### **Challenge:**

• To conclude this activity, challenge your child to write or draw the rhyming words they have collected using his/her phonetic knowledge.

Additional ways to support your child:	Extension:
