ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION

Introduction:

- Read/watch today's focus story: The Rainbow Fish.

Main Activity:



- Invite your child to use his/her critical thinking skills to converse about the story.

- Ask your child to recall what happened in the story (this is the plot).

- Can you tell me who the main character is?
- Where is the story set? Where does it take place?

- How did you think rainbow fish felt when he gave away his special scale?

- What would you do if you were Rainbow Fish?
- How was he being kind?
- What could the other fish do for Rainbow Fish?

- Encourage your child to consider different possible endings for the story.

- How else could the story have ended?

- Model this to your child: "After the Rainbow Fish shared his scales with his friends, he was so excited that he wanted to throw a party. So, he invited all his friends to his house and they celebrated being kind to one another."

Challenge:

Invite your child to draw a picture to show their alternative story ending idea.
