Individual Activity Lesson Plan



Date: Tuesday 28th April 2020

Activity Title: My favourite adventure – Talking Tables

Learning Intention: -

To use language to describe a memorable moment in detail.

Links to EYFS:

- Begins to use more complex sentences to link thoughts (e.g. using and, because) Communication & Language
- Uses talk to connect the ideas, explain what is happening and anticipate what might happen next, recall and relive past experiences. Communication & Language
- Sometimes gives meanings to marks as they draw and paint.
 Literacy

Activity Overview:

Talk about your favourite adventures before attempting to draw pictures relating to these experiences.

Resources:

- Paper
- Colouring pencils/crayons

Key vocabulary:

Think of, recall, remember, explain, tell me, describe, happened, next, after, before, when, where, how, why.

ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key questions)



Introduction:

Together with your child listen to the story 'The Snail and the Whale' by Julia Donaldson and encourage her/him to recall the main characters and their adventures – if possible, look at the illustrations to help them remember.

Main Activity:

- Give your child a piece of paper and explain that he/she will be drawing a picture of their most favourite adventure (A holiday, a trip to the farm, a Zoo visit, A playdate, etc.)
- Model the activity for your child if needed, draw a picture, and explain your memory in detail.
- Whilst they are working on their drawing or straight after (depending on the level of their concentration) encourage them to describe their most memorable moments to you.
- Please remember to give your child enough time to think and answer. (Sometimes, children need up to 40 seconds to process the questions we ask them.)

The key questions:

- 1. Can you explain to me what an adventure means?
- 2. Can you tell me your favourite adventure?
- 3. I really like the way you drew this. Can you remind me what is happening?
- 4. Whom did you meet there?
- 5. What was the best part of that day and why?
- 6. Can you describe what you are wearing/ eating/ holding?
- 7. What had happened before/after?

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Additional ways to support your child:

Encourage your child to describe one of the Snail's adventures. Now ask them to draw a picture related to the story whilst looking at the illustrations in the book if needed.

Extension:

- -Encourage your child to recall and draw a picture of their least favourite moment. Ask them to explain why they feel this way. Challenge them to think of ways that memory could have been made more fun/interesting.
- -Invite your child to write some simple sentences to describe what their picture is dipicting .
