Activity Title: Egg Scoop

ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key questions)	

Introduction:

- Ask your child to help you to fill up the small plastic containers with water and place them inside the large plastic tub. This could be an under the bed storage box.
- Add the plastic Eater eggs to the smaller containers and put some water inside these eggs too.
- Add some scoopers such as whisks, ladles and spoons.

Main Activity:

- Encourage your child to use the whisks, ladles and spoons to scoop up the plastic eggs out of the smaller containers, into the large container.
- You can show your child how to whisk the water and could even add some soap to this activity to create bubbles.
- After your child has had enough of scooping out the eggs, you can give them jugs and cups for them to practice pouring water.
- Allow your child to explore and experiment.

*What happens if we use a spoon with holes in it? *Can you scoop out a pink egg?

Activity review:

* You can ask your child to look around the house to see if they can find anything else they can use to scoop the eggs out with or pour water with.

- *What did you enjoy about this activity?
- *If we did this activity again, what would you like to put in the water?

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Additional ways to support your child:

- Give your child larger items to help them scoop the eggs out with.
- Provide your child with large jugs and cups to pour water. Encourage them to use two hands to make it easier for them to pour the water from a large jug into the small plastic container.

Extension:

- Give your child smaller items (e.g. a table spoon) to make it more challenging to scoop the eggs out with.
- Provide your child with smaller jugs and cups to pour water. Encourage your child to use one hand to pour the water from a small jug into a cup and vice versa.
- You could turn this activity into a colour sorting activity. "Can you put all the pink/blue eggs in a same group?"
