Activity Title: Foil printing moon	
Learning Intention: EAD: Experiments with blocks, colours and marks.	Activity Overview: Your child will use tin foil to print paint to make a moon.
Links to EYFS: Expressive arts and design: Exploring using media and materials.	
Resources: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tin foil • Paper • Paint • Pen 	Key vocabulary: Moon, silver, tin foil, paint, press, push, stamp, print, round, circle, shape, size.
ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)	
<p>Introduction:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For this activity, you will need to prepare a piece of paper, a pen, scrunched up balls of tin foil and paint. • Show your child a photograph of the moon (scroll down) and ask him/her, “Where do we see the moon?” “What colour is the moon?” “What shape is the moon?” <p>Main Activity:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Draw a large circle on your piece of paper. Mummy or Daddy can help you with this. • Take one of your balls of tin foil and dip it into the paint. • Use the tin foil to dab the paint onto your paper to decorate your moon. • Continue to do this until your moon is covered in paint. • You can add glitter to your moon too. 	
<p>Activity review:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Your child can make other planets using the same tin foil printing technique. 	
<p>Additional ways to support your child:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Offer your child a large range of mark making tools such as pens, paint brushes and paints as well as the tin foil for them to explore. 	<p>Extension:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Think about the planets. What colour are they? What shape? What size? Can you paint them?
