

Individual Activity Lesson Plan

Date: Friday 29 th May 2020	
Activity Title: Handprint Firefighters	
Learning Intention: Makes connections between their movement and the marks they make.	Activity Overview: The children will create firefighters using handprints.
Links to EYFS: Physical Development: Moving and Handling: 16-26 months.	
Resources: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Paint • Paper/card • Paintbrush • Felt tip pens 	Key vocabulary: Paint, hand, fingers, firefighters, red, yellow, black, helmet, face, eyes, nose, mouth.
ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)	
Introduction: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Look through some images of real firefighters together with your child – maybe you have some stories at home about firefighters and fire engines. 	
Main Activity: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Help your child to paint their hand – you could put a different colour on each fingertip for the faces or add them on afterwards. • Let the paint dry, then support your child to draw eyes, noses, mouths, etc. Then add the helmets, arms and anything else you can think of together. 	
Activity review: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Play this 5 Little Firemen song with Makaton signs to see some real firefighters. The children will already know this song from their music classes at Clowns. 	
Additional ways to support your child: If your child is unsure about having their hand painted, you could let them paint your hand instead. Alternatively, you could draw around your child's hand and they could decorate and colour it in with felt tip pens, pencils or crayons.	Extension: Encourage your child to also draw the hose, water and a fire for the firefighters to put out.
