

# Individual Activity Lesson Plan

<b>Date:</b> 22.05.20	
<b>Activity Title:</b> To make a hanging star decoration	
<b>Learning Intention:</b>	<b>Activity Overview:</b> Your child will make a hanging star decoration using the resources listed.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Communication and language: Uses simple sentences.</li> </ul>	
<b>Links to EYFS:</b>	<b>Key vocabulary:</b> Stars, count, hang, cut, shapes, string, stick, tie, knot, long, short, sky, night, shine, sparkle.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Communication and language: Speaking: 22-36 months: Uses simple sentences.</li> </ul>	
<b>Resources:</b>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>String</li> <li>Hole punch and/or scissors</li> <li>Twig, stick or wooden object.</li> <li>Paper</li> <li>Pens, glitter, paint.</li> </ul>	
<b>ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)</b>	
<p><b>Introduction:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Collect the resources listed above and lay them out on the table.</li> <li>You can use a twig, a long stick or any long wooden item you may have at home.</li> <li>Show your child this image of the hanging star decoration they will be recreating.</li> <li>Test to see if your child knows where we see stars.</li> <li>Encourage your child to sing 'Twinkle Twinkle little star.'</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Main Activity:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Ask Mummy or Daddy to draw lots of stars onto a piece of paper.</li> <li>Your child will decorate these stars using pens, crayons, paint, glitter or whatever they choose.</li> <li>Once the stars have been decorated, ask an adult to cut them out for you.</li> <li>At the top of each star a small hole will need to be made. This can be done using a hole puncher or scissors.</li> <li>Your child will need to thread a piece of string through each of the holes in the stars and an adult will help to tie a knot near the top of the stars to stop the string from falling out.</li> <li>Ensure the strings are different lengths like shown in the picture.</li> <li>One by one, tie the hanging stars around the stick, twig or wooden object.</li> <li>Cut one longer piece of string and tie it around either end of the stick, twig or wooden object for you to hang it up.</li> <li>And here you have it, your hanging star decoration.</li> <li>Throughout this activity, ensure you are asking your child lots of open ended questions to allow them to communicate using fuller sentences.</li> </ul>

<p><b>Additional ways to support your child:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Ask your child very simple questions to encourage them to answer questions using 1-3 worded answers.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Extension:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Ask your child open ended questions and give them time to reply to encourage them to use more complex, fuller sentences.</li> </ul>
