Introduction:

- Look at the book "The smartest giant in town." <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=cfiPrA8E3qE</u>
- Talk about how to make a boat and a sail for the goat.

What equipment will you need? How will you make the boat move across the water?

Main Activity:

- Collect all the materials you need for the activity.
- Use a plastic tub such as an empty butter tub or a large yoghurt pot as your boat.
- Make a sail using either some fabric or plastic and attach this to either a straw or stick.
- Talk about the shape of the sail. Use blue tack or playdough to stand the straw or stick up in the boat.
 Place your boat into the water and together, find out ways to make the boat move across the water.
 E.g. blow onto the sail, make a paper fan/battery operated fan and use this. Blow through a straw/or rolled up paper.

Activity review:

Discuss with your child how well you think this activity wet. What happened to the boat? Did it move? Did the wind that was created move the water as well? What happened to the boat then? Did the boat float or sink? Talk about how/why the boat floated.

Additional ways to support your child:	Extension:
 Look at books with sailing boats in. Role model language for your child and ask your child simple questions throughout. 	 Ask your child lots of open ended questions and give them time to answer. Talk about floating and sinking using different objects. Stones, corks etc Make another boat using different material such as a tin foil cooking container. What's the difference? Which one moves faster?
