

Individual Activity Lesson Plan

Activity Title: Making an emergency vehicle	
Learning Intention: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Beginning to make believe by pretending 	Activity Overview: Allow your child to use their imagination to make an emergency vehicle out of a cardboard box.
Links to EYFS: Expressive arts and design: Being imaginative: 22-36 months	
Resources: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Cardboard box Paper Paint Felt tips Scissors 	Key vocabulary: Fire engine, police car, ambulance, siren, steering wheel, wheels, window, seat, cardboard box, paint, draw, paper, cut, shapes, circle, square, rectangle.
ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)	
Introduction: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Find a large cardboard box, like a nappy box. Discuss with your child different emergency vehicles and who uses them. Please scroll down to look at pictures of emergency vehicles below. Let your child choose which emergency vehicle they would like to make. <p>*What colour paints will you need?</p> <p>*What shape are the wheels?</p> <p>Main Activity: How to make a fire Engine</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Cut the top off the cardboard box to ensure there is enough room for your child to sit inside it. Paint the whole of the cardboard box red, like a fire engine. <p>*How many wheels does the fire engine need?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Get your child to paint four circles directly onto the box for the wheels or paint four circles onto a piece of paper then cut them out and stick them onto the box. You could also use 4 paper plates as wheels if you have them. Paint onto the box a window and some lights. Think about what else a fire engine might have on it. A Ladder? Wing mirrors? Support your child in being creative with their thinking and see what ideas they come up with. <p>Activity review:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> We would love to see photographs of your child making their emergency vehicle. Additional ways to support your child: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Allow your child to look at the picture of their chosen emergency vehicle whilst making it, for them to refer back to for ideas.
