Individual Activity Lesson Plan Topic: Space





Activity Title: 'Aliens love underpants' : Matching underpants

Learning Intention: To categorise the underpants according to colours or patterns.	Activity Overview: Your child will need to match the corresponding pictures of underpants into pairs.
Links to EYFS: Mathematics-Shape, space and measure: Beginning to categorise objects according to properties such as size.	
Resources:	Key vocabulary:
• Print out of pictures of underpants attached. If you do not have a printer, don't worry you can draw some of your own underpants similar to the ones in the pictures.	Underpants, Aliens, match, pairs, two, the same, different, colours, spots, stripes, stars, dinosaurs, frills. Are these two pictures the same? Can you find the matching pair of underpants?
ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)	

Introduction:

- Print out the pictures of different underpants attached to this activity plan.
- Cut the pictures out and lay them out on the table, faced upwards.



Main Activity:

- Call your child over to this activity and make sure they have somewhere comfortable to sit, or stand.
- Pick up one of the pictures of pants and ask your child if they are able to select the matching picture from the pictures remaining on the table.
- Continue to do this until all the pictures on the table have a matching pair.
- Lay the pictures back out on the table, again facing upwards.
- Now test your child to see if they can find the matching pairs of paints without any adult help.
- Once your child has become confident at matching the pairs of pants, lay them back onto the table, however this time facing downwards.
- Now let's play pairs! You may need to demonstrate this first.
- Turn two pictures over at a time.

*Do they look the same?

*Are they different?

*Are they the same colours?

*Do they have the same patterns?

- If they match, put the pictures over to one side. However, if they are different, face the pictures downwards again.
- This could also be a turn taking game with you and your child.
- Continue this until you have found all the pairs.

Activity review:

Let's see who has the most pairs. Allow your child to design their own pair of underpants.

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Additional ways to support your child:	Extension:
 Pair the underpants whilst they are facing upwards so your child can visually see the colours and designs. Only lay out 2-3 pairs of underpants to start with. 	 Lay out all of the pairs of pants and allow your child to independently match them. Play a game of pairs with your child.
