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| Activity Title: Number puzzle (people who help us) | |
| Learning Intention: Recites some number names in sequence | Activity Overview: Cut up and reconstruct in number order a picture of: "people who help us" |
| Links to EYFS: Mathematics – Numbers 22-36 months | |
| Resources: paper, ruler, colouring pencils/pens/paints, pictures from old books/magazines, scissors, number line (make your own) | Key vocabulary: 1,2,3,4,5. Copy, repeat after me, what comes after, how many have you got. |

ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)

Introduction:

• Cut up and reconstruct a picture/drawing/painting of "people who help us" leaving a boarder at the side to add a number in. This could be 1,2,3 or 1,2,3,4,5

Main Activity:

- On a piece of A4 or similar size paper help your child draw a line/margin down the edge of the paper (left hand side)
- Fold this under (this will be your number line)
- Either get your child to draw/paint a person (their interpretation of a person) on the paper
- If you have a picture of a person cut it out for them and help them stick it on to the paper
- Try to fill the whole page with the drawing/picture
- Unfold the paper to show the border
- Once dry. Cut the picture/drawing horizontally into 3 or 5 equal strips (you will need to do this for them)
- Write a number in the margin at the side of each cut out piece e.g. head 1, body 2, etc
- Mix up your number puzzle
- Now reconstruct the picture using the numbers/picture to help complete the number puzzle

Activity review:

- Could your child recite the numbers in order (with your help)
- Which "person that helps us" did your child choose to draw/paint
- Did they manage to reconstruct the puzzle person?
