ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key questions)		
 Listen to the story On the Way Home (see story link above). Encourage your child to join in with the repetitive phrases as they liste "Look at my bad knee " "How did you do it?" "And that's how I got my poorly knee!" Main Activity: Explain to your child that s/he is going to tell you his/her own story, a shome. Encourage your child to be as animated and inventive as possible. Your child can start the story telling with: "Look at my bad knee." 	-
