

Individual Activity Lesson Plan



Date: Monday 18 th May		
Activity Title: Describe the Wolf		
Learning Intention: To use descriptive language to create a new title for the Big Bad Wolf.		Activity Overview: Your child will create a new title for the ‘BIG BAD WOLF’ using descriptive language.
Links to EYFS: Communication and Language: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Uses talk to organise, sequence and clarify thinking, ideas, feelings and events.• Extends vocabulary, especially by grouping and naming, exploring the meaning and sounds of new words.		
Resources: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Paper• Pencils/colours/crayons• Print out of Descriptive Words Activity Sheet (if you don’t have a printer available, create your own word cards)• Scissors		Key vocabulary: describe, descriptive, description, look, big, bad, scared, little, tiny, brave, kind, colours etc.
ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key questions)		
Introduction: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Using your child’s prior knowledge of the story of <i>The Three Little Pigs</i>, talk about why the wolf is called the Big Bad Wolf.2. Ask your child to describe what the Big Bad Wolf looks like.3. Print out, cut, or create your own descriptive word cards.4. Using the descriptive word cards, asks your child to put two different describing words together followed by wolf. This is your new descriptive name for the wolf!5. Encourage your child to continue mixing the word cards up to create lots of different combinations of titles for the wolf.6. Invite your child to write/copy the different names down (using pencil and paper).7. Once they have made lots of different combinations, ask your child which name is their favourite

Additional ways to support your child: <p>Support your child with sounding out the initial letter in the descriptive words. Encourage him/her to write the initial letter and then write the rest of the word in yellow/highlighter, for him/her to trace over.</p>		Extension: <p>Challenge your child to think of his/her own descriptive names for the wolf and write them down.</p>
