Individual Activity Lesson Plan



Date: Thursday 7th May 2020

Activity Title: London Landmarks

Learning Intention: to comment and ask questions about the world they live in and begin to recognise and name familiar landmarks in their

locality

Links to EYFS: Understanding the World: The World:

Comments and asks questions about aspects of their familiar world such as the place where they live or the natural world.

Activity Overview: Read today's focus story and then find out more about where we live and play a matching game.

Resources:

*Today's focus story: *Katie in London* by James Mayhew Link: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=lmrNxvC9bb4

*London Landmark Cards (if you don't have a printer available, create your own cards, by cutting out small pieces of paper and drawing images/labels on them)

*Children's scissors

Key vocabulary:

London, local area, landmarks, popular, where, map, why, what.

ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key questions)

Introduction:

- *Read/watch Katie in London (see link above).
- *Who are the main characters in the story?
- *Where is the story set?
- *What was your favourite part of the story/why?
- *Did you recognise any of the places Katie visited?
- *Explain that we also live in the city of London.
- *Look at the map of London attached below and discuss any of

the landmarks you have visited – perhaps you can find photographs of you at some of the landmarks to compare with pages from the story.

Main Activity:

- *Cut out the London Landmark cards and sort them into two piles photos and names of landmarks.
- *Lay the cards out on the floor, facing downwards, in two separate groups (photos and names of landmarks).
- *Take it in turns to turn over one card from each pile. If the photograph and the name of the landmark match, it's a pair and the player keeps the cards. If the cards don't match, put them back.
- *The winner is the player with the most cards at the end of the game.
- *Support your child and encourage them to have a go at reading the names of the landmarks independently.

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Additional ways to support your child:

If your child is finding it challenging to remember the names of some of the London landmarks, create actions to match the names. E.g. make your arms tick like the hands on a clock when you say Big Ben.
