Date: Monday 18 th May 2020		
Activity Title: True or False		
Learning Intention: To listen carefully to a story before deciding whether some statements are TRUE or FALSE. Links to EYFS: Communication & Language/Literacy: Listens carefully to books. Links statements to stories.	Activity Overview: Listen to today's story and identify true and false statements.	
Resources: • Story link for <i>The Way Home for Wolf:</i> https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCn9Kx D9nnBpQO2txlssq-A?view_as=subscriber	Key vocabulary: true, false, real, made up, happen, story, fake.	

ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key questions)

Introduction:

• Explain to your child that they will need to listen very carefully to today's story: *The Way Home for Wolf.* This is because once they have listened to the story, they are going to be asked whether the statements below are TRUE (happened in the story) or FALSE (have been made up).

THE WAY HOME FOR WOLF

Main activity:

- Read the 5 statements below and ask your child to think about whether they came from the story or are made up.
- 1. Wilf liked to try everything ALL ON HIS OWN. (T)
- 2. A lion moved into the wolf cave, so the wolves had to find somewhere new to live. (F)
- 3. A blanket of stars was his bed for the night. (T)
- 4. Wilf went to the beach for a lovely swim. (F)
- 5. Wilf made lots of friends on his journey. (T)



- Now, ask your child to make up their own statement about the story. Once they have thought of it
 they can share with you and get you to answer whether it is True or False. (They may need to listen to
 a section of the story again).
- If the above is too challenging, create the statements for your child and continue to invite him/her to guess whether they are TRUE or FALSE.

Additional ways to support your child:	Extension:
Give your child examples of what a True or False	Think of other well-known stories and work together
statement could sound like e.g.	to come up with TRUE and FALSE statements, before
'Daddy's hair is purple' (F)	asking another family members to join in and answer.
'Daddy's hair is brown' (T)
