


# Individual Activity Lesson Plan

<b>Date:</b> Thursday 18 <sup>th</sup> June 2020	
<b>Activity Title:</b> Create Binoculars	
<b>Learning Intention:</b>	<b>Activity Overview:</b> Create binoculars using different tools and materials.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use different materials and tools with purpose.</li> </ul>	
<b>Links to EYFS: Expressive Arts and Design:</b>	<b>Key vocabulary:</b> Binoculars, follow, instructions, glue, cut, paint.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Realises tools can be used for a purpose.</li> <li>Constructs with a purpose in mind, using a variety of resources.</li> </ul>	
<b>Resources:</b>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Storybook <i>Rumble in the Jungle</i> by Giles Andreae or click on the following video link: <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=bXnElKAmZIk">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=bXnElKAmZIk</a></li> <li>Two toilet rolls</li> <li>PVA glue</li> <li>Scissors</li> <li>String or ribbon</li> <li>Paper (any colour)</li> <li>Items to decorate (markers, crayons, stickers, sequence, tissue paper)</li> </ul>	
<b>ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key questions)</b>	
<b>Introduction:</b>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Revisit the story of the day <i>Rumble in the Jungle</i> and talk about the animals that appeared in the book.</li> </ul> <p>*Which animals from the book do you remember?</p> <p>*Which animal is your favourite? Why?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Ask your child to think about what you could use to spot or see the jungle animals better.</li> </ul> <p>*Do you know the name of the object that helps us to see things that are far?</p>	
<b>Main Activity:</b>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Explain to your child that today, he/she is going to create binoculars using different tools and materials.</li> <li>Show your child the <i>Picture Instructions</i> at the end of the lesson plan as an example of what he/she will be creating and what it might look like.</li> <li>Gather your resources listed above.</li> <li>First, glue the toilet rolls together and leave to dry.</li> <li>Using paper of your child's choice, wrap it around the width of the binoculars and trim off the excess paper with scissors. Use glue to secure the paper around the rolls.</li> <li>Invite your child to decorate the binoculars in any way he/she likes.</li> <li>Once decorated, using scissors, carefully cut small holes on the outside edge of each roll.</li> <li>Using a string, thread it through the holes and tie a knot to secure.</li> </ul> <p>*How are you going to decorate your binoculars?</p> <p>*What do you need so you can wear the binoculars around the neck?</p> <p>*How do you think we could make holes?</p>	
	
<b>Challenge:</b>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Get inspired by the ideas attached at the end of the lesson plan and create binoculars for each member of your family.</li> </ul>	
<b>Additional ways to support your child:</b> Guide your child throughout the whole process, verbalising what you are doing and offer as much	<b>Extension:</b> Use your binoculars and go on a jungle expedition.
