### **ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)**

#### **Introduction:**

- Show your child the book cover of the story of the day *The Tiger Who Came to Tea* and discuss together what the story might be about.
- \*What can you see in the picture? Do you think they are friends? Why/why not?
- \*Do you know what the story will be about?


## **Main Activity:**

- Explain to your child that you are going to read/watch the story together. Once you finish reading/watching, ask your child about the overall story, key events and relevant comments.
- \*Who rang the doorbell?
- \*Why did the tiger come to Sophie's house?
- \*Why did Sophie, mum and dad have to go to the café for tea?
- \*Why did the tiger never come back for tea?
- Once your child has a good idea of the story, tell him/her that he/she is going to look at some pictures from the book and put them in the order as they happened in the story.
- Show him/her the printed out template and invite him/her to cut out the pictures.
- Lay out the pictures on the table and ask your child to find the picture with the beginning of the story.
- \*How did the story start? Yes, Sophie and her Mummy were having tea together.
- Continue to go through the pictures, arranging them in the order as they appeared in the book.
- \*What happened next in the story? And then?
- \*How did the story end?
- If necessary, look back in the book/video again to remind your child the order of the events.
- When all the pictures are correctly ordered, invite your child to retell the story, following the pictures.
   Support your child in using sequence words such as first, then, later, after, in the end.

#### **Challenge:**

- Choose 3 cards and have a go at writing a simple sentence to match each of them.
- Or, write a label for an object on each of the story cards.
