

Individual Activity Lesson Plan

Date: Tuesday 23 rd June 2020	
Activity Title: Teacups and Teapot	
Learning Intention: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use different resources to make and decorate teacups and a teapot. 	Activity Overview: Use a variety of materials to create and design a tea set.
Links to EYFS: Expressive Arts and Design: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Manipulates materials to achieve a planned effect. Constructs with a purpose in mind, using a variety of resources. Physical Development: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Uses one-handed tools and equipment, e.g. makes snips in paper with child scissors. 	
Resources: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Printed out template – Teacup and Teapot (if a printer is unavailable, draw your own tea set, using the template as an example) Items to decorate (markers, crayons, stickers, sequences, glitter, paint, tissue paper) Scissors Glue 	Key vocabulary: Teacup, teapot, decorate, design, cut, glue, paint, stick.
ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key questions)	
Introduction: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Revisit the story of the day <i>The Tiger Who Came to Tea</i> together with your child. <p>*What were Sophie and her Mummy doing when the tiger arrived?</p>	
Main Activity: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Explain to your child that he/she is going to create his/her own teacups and a teapot for a tea party. Gather your resources listed above. Show your child the printed template and encourage him/her to cut out the teacups and the teapot. Guide and support your child with using scissors if needed. Invite your child to decorate the tea set in any way he/she likes, using different resources and materials. Once the cups and teapot are decorated, follow the dotted lines to fold the paper and use glue to stick together the opposite sides. You are ready to enjoy your cup of tea! <p>*How are you going to decorate your teacup?</p> <p>*What colour would you like to use?</p> <p>*Would you like to add anything else?</p>	
Challenge: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Suggest to your child to use blocks to build a table to display his/her tea set. 	
Additional ways to support your child: If your child finds it too challenging to cut around the lines, cut out the teapots and a teacup for them.	Extension: Encourage your child to use his/her tea set to have a role-play tea party with the family or his/her toys.
