

Individual Activity Lesson Plan

Date: Friday 26 th June 2020	
Activity Title: Name Letter Hunt	
Learning Intention: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Listen to the instructions and find name letters. 	Activity Overview: Follow the clues to find your name letters around the house. Put the letters together to spell your name.
Links to EYFS: Communication and Language: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Is able to follow directions/instructions. Shows understanding of prepositions such as 'under', 'on top', 'behind' by carrying out an action or selecting correct picture. Literacy: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Recognises familiar words and signs such as own name. 	
Resources: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Letter cards to form your child's name Template – Name Search Riddles (Challenge) 	Key vocabulary: Prepositions – next to, on, under, inside, on top, behind, between.
ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key questions)	
Introduction: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Hide your child's name letters around the house (Tip: Note down where you put them). Recap the story of the day <i>Giraffes Can't Dance</i> and talk about how everybody is unique. Point out that one of the things that makes us special is our name. Main Activity: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Explain to your child that you have hidden his/her name letters around the house that he/she needs to find by following your instructions. Give your child the first direction: Your first letter is hidden somewhere in your room. It's under your favourite toy. Depending on your child, you can keep the instructions as simple or elaborate as needed. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Your first letter is under your pillow (object you use at night to rest your head on). *Your second letter is between your books (things that we read before you go to sleep). *The next letter is next to the thing that you use to brush your teeth. *Your other letter is inside the object that keeps our food cool. *Another letter is inside the drawer where you have your things that keep your feet warm. *The next letter is on top of the shelf next to the lamp. *Your last letter is under the thing we sit on when we watch TV. Once your child has collected all the letters, invite him/her to put the letter together to form his/her name. Challenge: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Challenge your child to follow the provided riddles. Invite your child to hide your name letters and give you instructions where to find them. 	
Additional ways to support your child: Keep the directions simple, using only two or three prepositions such as on, under and behind.	Extension: Encourage your child to practise writing his/her name and check they are correctly forming each letter.
