# **Individual Activity Lesson Plan**



Date: Wednesday 10 <sup>th</sup> June 2020	
Activity Title: Egg Carton Tortoise	
Explore and experiment with colours and see how they change when being mixed.  Links to EYFS: Expressive Arts and Design:	Activity Overview:  Experiment with different shades of green and create a tortoise using an egg carton.
<ul> <li>Experiments with marks.</li> <li>Explores colour and how colours can be changed.</li> <li>Realises tools can be used for a purpose.</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Resources:</li> <li>Egg Carton</li> <li>Green paint (white, blue and yellow to create different shades of green) and paint brushes</li> <li>Green pompoms</li> <li>Green card paper</li> <li>Googly eyes</li> <li>PVA glue</li> </ul>	Key vocabulary: Follow, instructions, paint, glue, dark, light (colour)
<ul><li>Scissors</li><li>Pipe cleaners (optional)</li></ul>	

### **ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key questions)**

### Introduction:

- Recap the story of the day *The Foolish Tortoise* and talk about the main character.
- \*What does the tortoise look like? What colour is he?
- \*Does he have a tail?
- \*How is the shell different from the rest of his body?

#### **Main Activity:**

- Explain to your child that he/she is going to create a tortoise using an egg carton.
- \*Which part of the tortoise's body will the egg carton be?
- Show your child the *Picture Instructions* at the end of the lesson plan as an example of what he/she will be creating and what it might look like.
- Gather the resources listed above.
- First, using scissors, cut the egg carton into individual 'shells'.
- Invite your child to paint the shells green. Let him/her experiment with creating various shades of green
  as all tortoises are of different green. (Tip: Adding white/yellow/blue paint will make green
  lighter/brighter/darker.)
- \*I wonder how you can make a darker/lighter green.
- \*What colour paint do you need to add to make it brighter?
- Leave your painted shells to dry thoroughly.
- Using scissors and a green card paper, cut out the tortoise's body (see picture 4 below for an example).
- Finally, assemble and glue your shell, cut out body, pompon and googly eyes to form a tortoise.
- \*What colour shall we use for a tortoise?
- \*Would you like to add anything more?



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\*What do we need to do next?

### **Challenge:**

- Use pipe cleaners for the tortoise's legs and tail.

### Additional ways to support your child:

Make your own tortoise first for your child to see what is expected from him/her. Guide him/her throughout the whole process, verbalising what you are doing and offer as much help as he/she needs.

#### **Extension:**

Allow your child to explore other colours and see how they change once he/she mixes them. Suggest for him/her to create brown, purple or different shades.

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
