

# Activity Lesson Plan

## Dinosaurs

<b>Date:</b> Friday 26 <sup>th</sup> June 2020	
<b>Activity Title:</b> Dinosaur paper plates	
<b>Learning Intention:</b> To follow simple instructions.	<b>Activity Overview:</b> To listen carefully to instructions to make a Dinosaur using a paper plate and collage resources.
<b>Links to EYFS:</b> Communication and Language: understanding	
<b>Resource:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A paper plate</li> <li>• Collage resources such as coloured tissue paper, coloured paper, glitter or sequins.</li> </ul>	<b>Key vocabulary:</b> Glue, stick, Dinosaur, paper, colour, green, blue, red, yellow, spread, roar, big, small, tall, short, eyes, ears, neck.
<b>ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key questions)</b>	
<p><b>Introduction:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Explain to your child today we are going to be making a dinosaur using a paper plate.</li> <li>• Show images of different types of dinosaur to your child.</li> <li>• Prepare collage resources.</li> </ul> <p><b>Main Activity:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Support your child by cutting a paper plate in half.</li> <li>• Using a piece of paper or card, cut out two legs, a tail and a head.</li> <li>• Give your child a range of collage resources such as tissue paper, cellophane, paint, glitter etc and allow them to decorate the paper plate (the dinosaurs body)</li> <li>• Think about the colour of a dinosaur. Use the photographs to help.</li> <li>• Stick on your dinosaurs legs, tail and head.</li> <li>• Using a pen, draw an eye on the dinosaurs face.</li> </ul> <p><b>Challenge:</b>            What other animal could you make using a paper plate? Perhaps you could think about animals and insects with a shell such as a snail or ladybird? What colours will you need? What resources will you need?</p>	
<p><b>Additional ways to support your child:</b>            Give your child simple instructions, one step at a time. Show your child images of dinosaurs to look at.</p>	<p><b>Extension:</b>            Give your child more complex instructions involving two parts.            Can you use your imagination to find resources around the house to dress up as a dinosaur?</p>
