

# Individual Activity Lesson Plan

<b>Date:</b> 05.06.20	
<b>Activity Title:</b> Handprint fish puppets	
<b>Learning Intention:</b> Shows control in holding and using jugs to pour, hammers, books and mark making	<b>Activity Overview:</b> Making a fish puppet out of handprints.
<b>Links to EYFS:</b> Physical development, moving and handling 22 – 36 months	
<b>Resources:</b> Paper/card paint, crayons, glitter, shiny paper, scissors, lolly stick, glue.	<b>Key vocabulary:</b> Handprints, press down, fish, shiny, water, sea, fin, tail, fingers.
<b>ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)</b>	
<p><b>Introduction:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Look at some pictures of fish, talk about their fins, mouth, tail etc</li> <li>• Explain to your child that fish live in the sea, how they breath, swim etc</li> <li>• Choose 2 or 3 different colours of paint nice bright ones (if you have them)</li> </ul> <p><b>Main Activity:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Let your child paint their own hands any colour they choose</li> <li>• Once they have done this help them to press their hands down onto the paper/card</li> <li>• Leave the handprint to dry</li> <li>• Cut out the handprint (you can do this for them)</li> <li>• Help you child to decorate the fish you can use glitter, small pieces of shiny paper</li> <li>• Turn the handprint to the side with the thumb pointing upwards (this is the fin)</li> <li>• The fingers become the tail</li> <li>• The heal of the hand is the fishes head make a little mouth and stick it on the edge of the heal</li> <li>• Make a small eye and place it above the mouth near the start of the thumb</li> <li>• Keeping the handprint on its side (thumb side up) stick your fish on top of the stick</li> <li>• Send a photo of your child’s finished fish to <a href="mailto:info@clownsnursery.co.uk">info@clownsnursery.co.uk</a> we would love to see them</li> </ul> <p><b>Activity review:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Talk about the parts of the fish, fin, tail, scales, how the fish breaths under water what other creatures live under the sea</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Additional ways to support your child:</b> Look at pictures of fish, talk about how the fish swim and breath under water. Your child may need a little help pressing their painted hands on to the card. Cut out the handprints for them</p>	<p><b>Extension:</b> Do some cutting activities with your child. Draw some lines for them to try to cut along (always supervise this activity)</p>
