


Individual Activity Lesson Plan

Date: Tuesday 16 th June 2020	
Activity Title: Handprint Giraffe	
Learning Intention:	Activity Overview: Use paint and your own hand to create a giraffe.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To experiment with colours and marks. 	
Links to EYFS: Expressive Arts and Design: Media & Materials:	Key vocabulary: Book, giraffe, paint, handprint, dance, press, pen, marker.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To experiment with colours and marks 	
Resources: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <i>Giraffes Can't Dance</i> by Giles Andreae book or printed pictures Plain paper sheet Paint in desired colours (yellow, brown and black if you make a traditional giraffe) Black marker or pen <p>Note: if you don't have paint, check out the other giraffe making craft ideas, on the additional resources sheets).</p>	
ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)	
Introduction: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read or listen to the story <i>Giraffes Can't Dance</i> by Giles Andreae with your child. Talk with your child about the story; ask them to describe the main characters and talk about the actions. 	
Main Activity: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Get all your resources ready for your child to use, before you start the activity. Explain to your child that they are going to create a giraffe using their handprint. Let your child decide what colour their giraffe and spots are going to be. Help your child to paint their hand completely and press it on a piece of paper. Next, ask them to use their fingertips to make spots on the giraffe's body. Let it dry for a while. Once dried, help your child to draw a face on their giraffe. Challenge: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ask your child questions such as: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Did you enjoy that story? *What was the story about? *What character did you like the most? *Did you enjoy making your own giraffe? *Did you enjoy painting your hand? 	
Additional ways to support your child: Make your own handprint first for your child to see what is expected from them, explaining step by step what you are doing.	Extension: Suggest creating a handprint to make other animals from the story.
