Activity Title: Paint a pebble (sea creatures)

ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)		

Introduction:

- While out on a walk or in the garden find some pebbles to paint (the flat ones are better)
- Let your child choose which sea creature they want to paint on their pebble (look at pictures or books)
- You could either draw an outline of a sea creature for them to colour in or just let them be creative

Main Activity:

- Wash and dry the pebbles
- Put a mixture of paints out for your child to use (nice bright colours)
- With a small paint brush or cotton bud let your child paint their chosen sea creatures onto the pebbles
- Leave the pebbles to dry
- Once dry, brush the pebble with PVA glue making sure all the paint is covered
- Leave to dry
- Once dry, wrap or put it in a box as a gift. Or keep as a decoration

- Talk about sea creatures; ask what colour they are? Where do they live? What do they eat? etc.
- Ask your child what colours they used?
- Who do they want to give the pebble to? (that is if they want to give it away)
