


# Individual Activity Lesson Plan

<b>Date:</b> 02.06.20	
<b>Activity Title:</b> Paint a pebble (sea creatures)	
<b>Learning Intention:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Shows control in holding and using jugs to pour, hammers, books, and mark making tools. Physical Development: Moving and Handling</li> </ul>	<b>Activity Overview:</b> Paint a sea creature on a pebble as a gift or for decoration.
<b>Links to EYFS:</b> Physical Development: Moving and Handling: 22 – 36 months	
<b>Equipment:</b> Pebble paint/felt tips PVA glue small brush/cotton bud.	<b>Key vocabulary:</b> Sea creatures pebble, what colour will you choose? Well done, keep trying, I like the way you did that.
<b>ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)</b>	
<b>Introduction:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>While out on a walk or in the garden find some pebbles to paint (the flat ones are better)</li> <li>Let your child choose which sea creature they want to paint on their pebble (look at pictures or books)</li> <li>You could either draw an outline of a sea creature for them to colour in or just let them be creative</li> </ul>	
<b>Main Activity:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Wash and dry the pebbles</li> <li>Put a mixture of paints out for your child to use (nice bright colours)</li> <li>With a small paint brush or cotton bud let your child paint their chosen sea creatures onto the pebbles</li> <li>Leave the pebbles to dry</li> <li>Once dry, brush the pebble with PVA glue making sure all the paint is covered</li> <li>Leave to dry</li> <li>Once dry, wrap or put it in a box as a gift. <b>Activity review:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Talk about sea creatures; ask what colour they are? Where do they live? What do they eat? etc.</li> <li>Ask your child what colours they used?</li> <li>Who do they want to give the pebble to? (that is if they want to give it away)</li> </ul>	
<b>Additional ways to support your child:</b> Look at books/pictures to get an idea what to paint Draw an outline for them first and get them to colour it in.	<b>Extension:</b> Make a small box to put the pebble in or design and paint their own wrapping paper.
