

Individual Activity Lesson Plan

Date: 08.06.20	
Activity Title: Cotton wool painting	
Learning Intention: Shows control in holding and using jugs to pour, hammers, books, and mark-making tools.	Activity Overview: Shows control when using pegs attached to cotton wool balls to paint with
Links to EYFS: Physical, moving and handling 22-36 months	
Resources: - Use an old muffin tray, cotton wool balls, paints, pegs, paper	Key vocabulary: dip, paint, colours, dab, hold, pattern, well done, keep trying.

ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)

Introduction:

- This activity will help your child develop their fine motor skills
- Encourage your child to put the peg onto the cotton wool (you may need to help them a little)

Main Activity:

- Use an old muffin tin and fill each section with different colour paints
- Attach a peg to a cotton wool ball (get your child to put the peg on by themselves)
- Put one ball (with peg attached) in each section
- Encourage your child to dab the cotton wool ball loaded with paint onto the paper (you can do one first to show your child what to do)
- Let them create an array of colour on the paper

Activity review:

- How did your child manage to attach the peg to the cotton wool?
- Did you have to help them?
- During the activity ask your child “what colour they are using”

Additional ways to support your child:

You may need to help them attach the pegs to the cotton wool ball but try to encourage them to do it. Let them practice first by just squeezing the peg this will help them to develop their fine motor skills

Extension:

Look at what happens when 2 colours are mixed. For example, blue and yellow make green. Have fun experimenting with colours
