Activity Title: Make a rainbow of colours using handprints	
Learning Intention: Experiment with blocks and marks	Activity Overview: Make a rainbow out of handprints
Links to EYFS: Expressive arts and design: - exploring and using media and materials 22 – 36 months	
Resources: A range of different coloured paints, pots, brushes, paper.	Key vocabulary: Hands, rainbow, colours, press down, what colour, wow, well done, keep trying
ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)	
<p>Introduction:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Look at rainbows talk about the colours of the rainbow Talk about the shape of the rainbow Make an example to see the shape and colour of the rainbow <p>Main Activity:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Have an example of a rainbow next to your child, this could be the example you made or a picture of one Draw an arch shape (this is your first row) Choose a colour together Either paint your child's hands or encourage them to paint their own hands Help your child to press their painted hands on the start of the arch shape Either stick with one colour to complete the first arch or let your child choose any colour Draw another arch under the first completed one leaving enough room to fit the next set of handprints on Make 4 arch rainbow handprints each one should be a little smaller than the one above <p>Activity review:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> During the activity ask your child what colour they are using Keep referring to the picture of the rainbow talk about the colours and shapes Take a photo and send your rainbow handprint and send it into info@clownsnursery.co.uk Thank you 	
<p>Additional ways to support your child:</p> <p>Keep telling and asking what colours they are using What shape is the rainbow. look at the example during the activity so they understand what a rainbow is.</p>	<p>Extension:</p> <p>Look around the house and in the garden to see how many colours you and your child can find.</p>
