




# Individual Activity Lesson Plan

<b>Date:</b> Wednesday 1 <sup>st</sup> July 2020	
<b>Activity Title:</b> Making Capes	
<b>Learning Intention:</b> to use a range of tools (to create a cape)	<b>Activity Overview:</b> design and make your very own superhero cape.
<b>Links to EYFS:</b> Expressive Arts & Design: -to manipulate materials to achieve a planned effect -uses simple tools and techniques competently and appropriately Physical Development: -Uses one handed tools and equipment e.g. makes snips with child scissors	
<b>Resources:</b> -Superhero Posters (no need to print) -Superhero Badge Template (printed if possible, or create your own) -Cape design template -A black bin bag -Scissors -Glue/glue spreader -Decorative materials	<b>Key vocabulary:</b> Superhero, props, cape, mask, design, tool, decorate, cut, spread, glue, draw.
<b>ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key questions)</b>	
<b>Introduction:</b> *Invite your child to look through the Superhero Posters. -I wonder what powers Winter Warrior has. -Why do you think this Superhero has chosen this colour suit? *Explain that today he/she is going to be a superhero and all superheroes need capes! *Invite your child to think about what they would like his/her cape to look like and encourage him/her consider the colours/style/theme/superhero name & persona. *Invite your child to draw his/her cape design on the template provided.	
<b>Main Activity:</b> *Encourage your child to look at their Cape Design and think carefully – what will they need to make his/her cape? *Encourage your child to gather the resources they need. *Support your child with following the set steps below.	
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Take a bin bag liner and cut it into two (making sure two handles remain).</li> <li>2) Mark out two diagonal lines to create a cape shape and follow the marks to cut to size. (see photo above)</li> <li>3) Cut a curve between the two handles (to create neck space and ensure the cape does not bunch up).</li> <li>4) Decorate the superhero badge. Encourage your child to think of a superhero name/theme for decoration.</li> <li>5) Use glue or tape to stick the superhero badge onto the cape.</li> </ol>	
  	

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6) Use any other resources you have available to decorate the cape.

\*Once your cape is dry, role-play superheroes!

**Additional ways to support your child:**

Support your child with cutting, by positioning his/her hand correctly.

**Extension:**

Draw a comic strip for the superhero character you have created.
