ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key questions)

Introduction:

- *Read/recap today's focus story The Tiger Who came to Tea by Judith Kerr.
- -Who are the main characters?
- -Where is the story set?
- -What happened at the beginning/middle/end of the story?
- -What did the Tiger eat?

Main Activity:

- *Ask your child if he/she would like to have a tea party.
- *Challenge your child to make an invite for a family member or a stuffed animal (someone who will be attending the tea party).
- *Explain the purpose of an invite: to tell someone about an event; share where/when it will be held; and say who is sending the invitation.
- *Show your child the invitation examples attached below the lesson plan.
- -What is similar between all of the invitations?
- -How are the invitations different?
- -Which invitation do you like most?
- -Do you think you will use some of the ideas you've seen?
- *Gather the resources listed above (us invitation template, if you wish).
- *Encourage your child to first to write any information they are able to on the invitation (you may want to write some key words using yellow pen/highlighter and encourage them to trace over it).
- *Support your child with copying letters from their name, to sign the invitation.
- *Then encourage your child to independently decorate the invite, using the resources you have available.

Activity review:

- What do you like most about your invitation?
- Is there anything you could do to make it even better?
- If you were going to make an invitation again, is there anything you'd do differently?



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Additional ways to support your child:

Write your child's name using yellow pen/highlighter and encourage him/her to trace over it.

Extension:

Encourage your child to use their phonetic knowledge to have a go at writing key words on the invitation.
