


Date: Monday 8 th June 2020 Activity Title: My Dinosaur Book	
Links to EYFS: Literacy:	dinosaurs and create your own
-Begins to read words and simple sentences.	dinosaur book.
-Uses some clearly identifiable letters to communicate meaning,	
representing some sounds correctly and in sequence.	
Equipment:	Key vocabulary: dinosaur, read,
-'Dinosaur Sentences' (no need to print)	letter, sound, blend, say, word,

ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key questions)

Introduction

- *Read today's story: *Katie and the Dinosaurs* by James Mayhew.
- *Explain to your child that now they are going to have a turn at reading.
- *Bring up the 'Dinosaur Sentences' template on a device and invite your child to have a go at reading the sentences. Encourage your child to sound out each letter in the word and then blend the sounds to say the word (note there are several tricky/red words which are not phonetically decodable).



Main Activity

- *Explain to your child that their challenge today is to create his/her own book all about dinosaurs.
- *Fold a piece of a4 paper in half (using all the pages, this will make a 4 page book add more paper if required).
- *Explain that on each page you'd like him/her to draw or stick a picture of a dinosaur and then write sentence underneath to describe/say something about that dinosaur.
- *Support your child with using their phonetic knowledge to have a go at writing words/sentences.
- *If it is more developmentally appropriate for your child to write words, invite them to label the dinosaurs.
