Individual Activity Lesson Plan Wild Animals



Date: Monday 22 nd June 2020	
Activity Title: Making Invitations	
Learning Intention: to form some clearly identifiable letters and write words using their phonetic knowledge.	Activity Overview: read today's focus story and the create invites for your own tiger tea
Links to EYFS: Literacy: *To form some clearly identifiable letters *Writes own name and other things such as labels and captions	party.
 Resources: Tea Party Invitation templates (printed if possible or draw your own) Mark making tools (pencils, crayons, felt tips etc.) Decorative materials (sequins, tissue paper etc.) Story link – see daily timetable 	Key vocabulary: story, character, setting, who, what, when, why, how, invitations, prepare, imaginary, write, form, copy.

ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key questions)

Introduction:

- *Read/recap today's focus story The Tiger Who came to Tea by Judith Kerr.
- -Who are the main characters?
- -Where is the story set?
- -What happened at the beginning/middle/end of the story?
- -What did the Tiger eat?

Main Activity:

- *Ask your child if he/she would like to have a tea party.
- *Challenge your child to make an invite for a family member or a stuffed animal (someone who will be attending the tea party).
- *Explain the purpose of an invite: to tell someone about an event; share where/when it will be held; and say who is sending the invitation.
- *Show your child the invitation examples attached below the lesson plan.
- -What is similar between all of the invitations?
- -How are the invitations different?
- -Which invitation do you like most?
- -Do you think you will use some of the ideas you've seen?
- *Gather the resources listed above (us invitation template, if you wish).
- *Encourage your child to use their phonetic knowledge to write simple words and phrases.
- -Who is the invite going to be addressed to?
- -Where is the tea-party taking place?
- -What time is the tea-party
- -Who is sending the invite?
- *Invite your child to independently decorate the invite, using the resources you have available.

Activity review:

- What do you like most about your invitation?
- Is there anything you could do to make it even better?



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• If you were going to make an invitation again, is there anything you'd do differently?

Additional ways to support your child:

Write out key information for your child to copy.

Extension:

Challenge your child to create an envelope and write an address for the family member/stuffed animal that they are sending the invite to.
