

Individual Activity Lesson Plan

Activity Title: Shape printing	
Learning Intention: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Notice simple shapes and patterns in pictures. 	Activity Overview: Use toilet roll tubes to create a shape piece of art.
Links to EYFS: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Mathematics, Shape space and measure, 22-36 months, 	
Resources: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Large piece of paper Different coloured paints Large tray (For paints) Toilet roll tubes 	Key vocabulary: Heart, rectangle, star, square, circle, triangle, paint, print, colours, sides, round, paper.
ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)	
<p>Introduction:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Using your hands, bend one of the toilet roll tubes into a shape. Repeat this with 4-6 toilet roll tubes so you have 4-6 different shapes. On a large tray, choose 4-6 colours of paint to pour onto the tray as shown in the picture. Lay a large piece of paper onto a flat surface. 	
<p>Main activity:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Choose on toilet roll tube at a time, dip it into the coloured paint of your child's choice and print it onto the paper. Repeat this several times until your child's piece of paper is covered in a variety of different shapes. Throughout this activity, you can test your child's understanding on colours and shapes by asking questions such as: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Where is the triangle? * Can you make a green circle? 	
<p>Activity review:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Test to see how well your child remembers their shapes. Your child could take one toilet roll tube at a time, for example a circle, and see what circular shaped items they can find in the house. 	
<p>Additional ways to support your child:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use the 4 most basic shapes: Circle, Triangle, rectangle and square 	<p>Extension:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use more complex shapes. These may include, diamond, star, oval, pentagon.
