Activity Title: Butterfly Painting

Learning Intention: Understands more complex sentences, e.g. 'Put your toys away and then we'll read a book.'

Links to EYFS: Communication and Language: Understanding

Resources:

- Paint
- Paintbrushes/stampers/sponges
- Paper/card

ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)

Introduction:

- Set out the resources for the activity and show your child some images of butterflies.
- Talk about their colourful wings and how they look the same on both sides.

Main Activity:

- Explain that they will be painting on one side of the paper and then folding it in half to create wings that look the same on both sides.
- Encourage your child to experiment with different colours and marks.
- Once your child has finished painting, help them to fold the paper in half so that both sides match.
- *What colour will your butterfly be?
- *Where do butterflies live?
- *What do butterflies eat?
- *Will you make a big butterfly or a small butterfly?

Activity review:

- Once the activity is dry, you could help your child to cut around the paint into a butterfly shape. You could also try helping your child to add antennae and draw the butterfly's body.
- Talk about the butterfly's life cycle from egg to caterpillar to cocoon to butterfly.
