


# Individual Activity Lesson Plan

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| <b>Date:</b> Thursday 2 <sup>nd</sup> July 2020  |   |
| <b>Activity Title:</b> Paper Caterpillar   |   |
| <b>Learning Intention:</b> Plays cooperatively with a familiar adult, e.g. rolling a ball back and forth.  | <b>Activity Overview:</b> The children will create a paper caterpillar by decorating and folding paper.   |
| <b>Links to EYFS:</b> Personal, Social and Emotional Development: Making Relationships   |   |
| <b>Resources:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Pens/crayons/chalks/pencils</li> <li>• Long inch-wide strips of paper or card</li> <li>• Drinking straws</li> <li>• Sticky tape</li> <li>• Googly eyes/stickers (if you have them)</li> <li>• <i>The Very Hungry Caterpillar</i> by Eric Carle</li> </ul>   | <b>Key vocabulary:</b><br>Caterpillar, eyes, fold, paper, draw, colour, decorate, make, help, together.   |
| <b>ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)</b>  |   |
| <b>Introduction:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Look at some photos of caterpillars with your child and explain that you will make some together by decorating them and then folding them into caterpillar shapes.</li> </ul>  |    |
| <b>Main Activity:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Encourage your child to make a variety of marks on the strips of paper/card.</li> <li>• Help your child to fold the paper into a concertina shape to create your wiggly caterpillars.</li> <li>• Stick or draw eyes on to the caterpillars.</li> <li>• Sellotape a section of straw onto the bottom of the caterpillar to create a handle.</li> </ul> <p>*How will you decorate your caterpillar? Stripes? Dots? Circles?<br/>           *What do caterpillars eat?<br/>           *Where do caterpillars live?<br/>           *What do caterpillars turn into?</p> |   |
| <b>Activity review:</b>  |   |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Read <i>The Very Hungry Caterpillar</i> together using the caterpillars as props.</li> </ul>  |   |
| <b>Additional ways to support your child:</b><br>Model different ways to decorate the caterpillars to inspire your child.  | <b>Extension:</b><br>Make a home together for the caterpillars using available resources. You could use cardboard boxes, shoe boxes, cardboard tubes, materials, etc. |
