

Date: 27/07/2020 Activity Title: Making a Pirate Telescope Learning Intention: Activity Overview: To use available resources to create a telescope to support role Your child will use a variety of resources to make a pirate play. telescope. Links to EYFS- Expressive Arts and Design- Being Imaginative: Uses available resources to create props to support role play. **Resources: Key vocabulary:** Book: Come Away from the Water, Shirley by John Burningham or Pirates, telescope, adventure, video link: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=i1hs7jzfSok scissors, cut, paint, decorate, Cardboard tube (kitchen roll, cling film and aluminium foil stick, glue, telescope, shiny, cardboard tube) 'What can you see?' Coloured card Scissors Mark making tools (paint, paintbrushes, felt-tips, crayons) Decoration (glitter, pompoms, tissue paper, stickers, etc.) Glue -**ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key questions)** Introduction: Read the book Come Away from the Water, Shirley by John Burningham or de R Come away from the water, Shirley watch the video link above. Discuss what happens and who appears in the story. *Who is Shirley? *Where is the story set? *What was Shirley doing meanwhile her parents were sitting on the chairs? Main Activity: After reading the story, talk to your child about what a telescope is and what it is used for. Explain to your child that he/she will be making his/her own pirate's telescope and encourage your child to find the resources needed. Gather the resources you need for this activity (as mentioned above) Find a cardboard tube (kitchen roll, cardboard tube from cling film or aluminium foil) Paint the tube in any colour you like and let it dry. Cut out two strips out using the coloured card. Wrap the strips around the both ends of the tube. Decorate your telescope however you like using stickers, glitter, pompons or the resources you have available at home. Activity review:

Get your telescope! 'Can you describe what you are seeing?'



Additional ways to support your child:

Support your child when using the resources. Encourage her/him to name the resources that they are using. Guide him/her throughout the whole process, verbalising what you are doing and offer as much help as he/she needs.

Extension:

You can design a pirate hat! You just need a card paper or newspaper and mark making resources to decorate it.
