

Individual Activity Lesson Plan

Date: Friday 03 rd July	
Activity Title: Life Cycle of a Frog – Split Pin Frog	
Learning Intention: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Practising using one-handed tools (scissors, hole-punch) • To help reinforce their fine motor skills as well as improving their creativity. 	Activity Overview: Make a funny frog and discuss its lifecycle.
Links to EYFS: Understanding the World: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physical Development • Expressive arts and design 	
Resources: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Printed out template – Split Pin Frog • Scissors, split pins (treasure tags), alternative (glue, masking tape) • Single hole punch, hole punch. 	Key vocabulary: Tadpoles, frogspawn, adult frog, lifecycle
ACTIVITY IMPLEMENTATION (including key question)	
Introduction: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Print the template onto a full A4 sheet of paper and explain your child that you will be making a frog craft using one and two handed tools and resources. - Discuss frog lifecycle before you start cutting and assembling. - Have fun! 	
Main Activity: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⌋ Cut out the frog pieces and put them away. ⌋ Make holes for the split pins (paper fasteners) to go through with a pencil. (TOP TIP: Use a piece of blu-tack behind the hole and press down carefully with the pencil to make a hole). (adult to support this step, please) ⌋ Construct your puppet using split pins (paper fasteners) to join the pieces together. ⌋ Now your frog puppet is ready to play with! 	
Additional ways to support your child: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⌋ Talk about different one or two handed tools that children and adults use. 	Extension: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⌋ Try to draw and cut out other stages of a frog lifecycle – make a tadpole or a froglet using split pins.
